CRAIG SHEEHY: New to training squad but welcome addition. Ran the water with style.

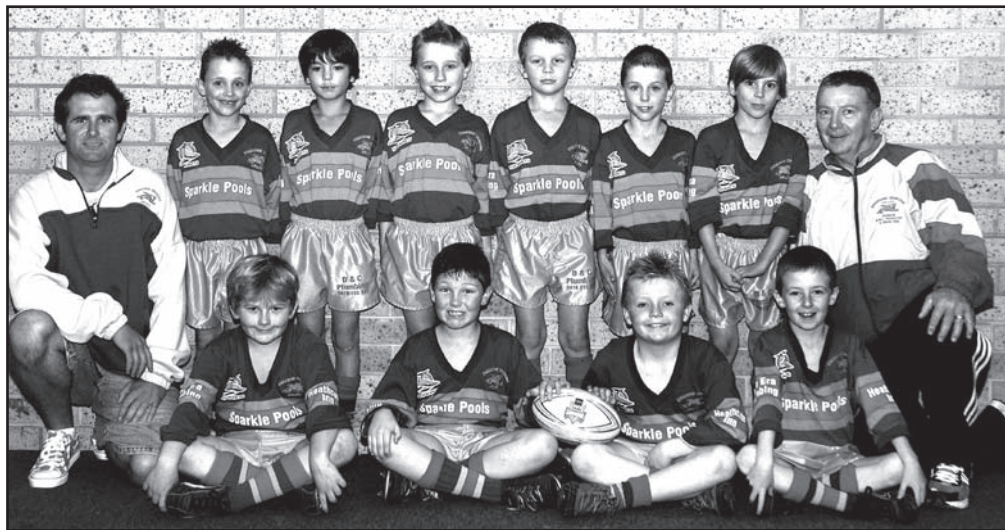
