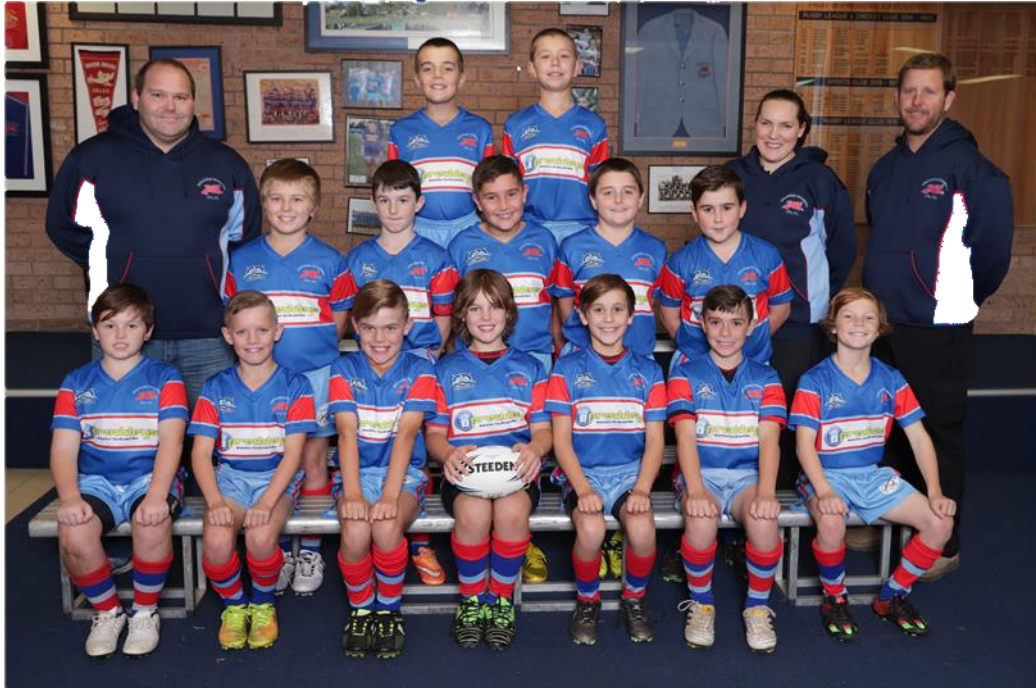

They got to form a guard of honour for the Sharks at Shark Park.

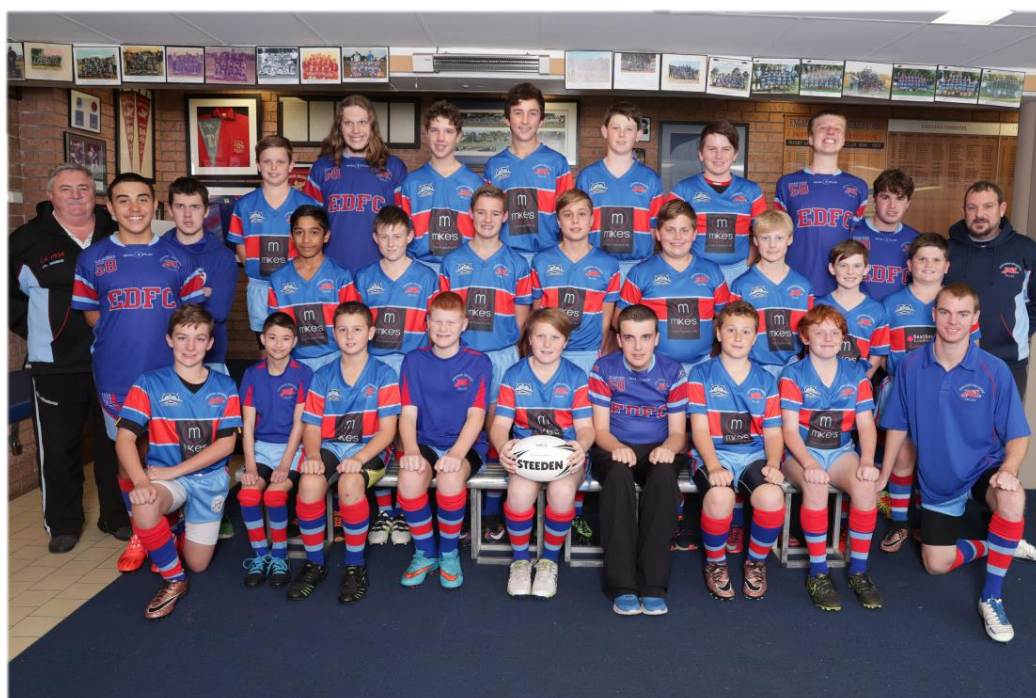
The Team trained hard every week and had a very enjoyable season.
